

Citing Sources in Assignments

For the purposes of assignment writing use one of the following two methods for citing your sources. Either:

1. Paste a copy of the web address of the site you have quoted from **immediately** after the quote. Ex. [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ba'ath_Party]
or
2. Put a number after the quote in brackets and at the end of the assignment cite your source. Ex: five decades rule of the Ba’ath’s Party.” [1]

The Syrian Civil Conflict

The Syrian civil war is a current armed conflict between forces devoted to the Ba’ath’s government party and those wanting to get out of it. This uprising started on March 15th, 2011 as well as other countries as part of a wider protest movement currently known as the Arab Spring. The Protestors “demanded the removal of President Bashar Al Assad as well as the end to the five decades rule of the Ba’ath’s Party.” [https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Ba'ath_Party]

In April 2011, the Syrian Army was industrialized to suppress the uprising, and soldiers were ordered to open fire on civilians. After months of military blockades, the protests changed into an armed rebellion. Hostility forces, mainly composed of defected soldiers and civilian volunteers, became gradually armed and organized as they unified into larger groups, with some groups receiving military help from several foreign countries. However, the rebels remained fractured, without organized leadership. The Syrian government characterizes the revolution as "armed terrorist groups."
